I am a parent of a developmentally disabled child, and her current IHSS provider (until she transitions to SLS services in August). In working to plan for her future, I have attended a variety of conferences pertaining to the developmentally disabled including two ARC policy conferences, and the 2014 Housing Conference sponsored by the San Francisco Autism Society. Having been through both the Fair Hearing and 4731 processes with no advocacy support, I have put hundreds of hours into reading and re-reading the Lanterman Act, Title 17 and Title 22, and their interpretations by Disability Rights and others.

What are your areas of interest in the developmental disability field and service system?

With the upcoming HCBS and self-determination transitions, the potential introduction of overtime for personal care providers, and other growing cost pressures, we are facing significant regulatory change coupled with the obligation to manage cost. At the same time, the ongoing explosion of new enabling technologies built upon cloud, wireless and wearable innovations are providing us with

unprecedented opportunities to deliver better service for IDD consumers at lower cost.

My interests are:

First, create or adapt policies to ease the adoption of emerging and evolving technology solutions that can improve outcomes and independence, while reducing service costs for the IDD population.

Second, improving information flow to this population to facilitate choice, deliver information about new solutions and training opportunities, and enable self-advocacy.

Third, adapt or create policies to improve availability of new and existing housing solutions. There is a huge wave of aging care providers who soon will no longer be able to care for their IDD charges; another wave of young autistic consumers who will soon age out of the school system and require housing solutions; and a declining supply of housing for the IDD population in California. Given the state's legal obligations to the IDD population, the financial impact of providing housing will be increasingly painful if not addressed promptly through more cost effective solutions.

Please explain why you wish to serve on the State Council on Developmental Disabilities, or on one of its Regional Advisory Committees:

The association of regional centers has described its current status as a system on the verge of collapse. It will take more than money to address the many changes and challenges facing the system. The SCDD has a pressing and vital role to play in updating and creating policies to help DDS and regional centers succeed.

What strengths would you bring to the State Council and/or Regional Advisory Committee?

1. Technology Expertise: I have worked with technology companies for the better part of 3 decades in various analytical, strategic and financial capacities. There is an emerging explosion of new solutions that will revolutionize care for the IDD population at lower cost -- but only if they can be adopted.
2. Executing Positive Change: For most of the 1990s, I consulted with distressed companies to create and execute new strategies to succeed.
3. Knowledge of Lanterman Act, Title 17 and Title 22 gained through advocacy.
4. Strategic Planning and Drafting Skills. Both as a consultant and Executive Vice President of Emulex Corporation, I drafted and monitored execution of corporate strategic plans. This was a collaborative process which required that differences be

explored and compromises be created, and resistance to change be overcome, all within a legal framework.

I joined by first advocacy group when she was three and finally diagnosed. As I struggled to have her receive services (she was denied by CCS at age 3), I realized that my education, drive, and ability to advocate put me in a position of responsibility to all the other families with disabled members who might not be so endowed. I became a full-time law student while the parent of three young daughters. Not only was it difficult to attend school with a family, but my husband and I were subjected to additional strains because of our disabled daughter who had developed seizures. My experiences only made me more determined than ever to advocate for systemic reforms.

In addition, as a newly licensed lawyer working in the field of labor and employment, I became familiar with the new ADA at a time when the AIDS epidemic was just beginning to gain momentum in San Francisco. I recognized, yet again, how civil rights legislation can pave the way for significant societal change.

What are your areas of interest in the developmental disability field and service system?

As a lawyer, I am particularly interested in institutional and systemic reforms which have the greatest impact on the disabled population, their families and

communities. My daughter is a client of the Regional Center of the East Bay where her burdened case manager handles sixty-plus clients in maze of meetings and crises.

We must speak forcefully and often to bolster are system's failing infrastructure, while we advocate for adequate funding for both the Regional Centers and our incredibly strained community service providers. Without such funding, hard-won civil rights are without meaning.

I wish to secure both a continuum of appropriate services for the broad range of disabled individuals and the opportunity for these individuals to work in a meaningful, integrated, and inclusive way in our society.

We need look to the future as well to be innovative in order to serve the needs of a more diverse and often younger disabled population. We must expect many youngsters who are on the autism spectrum, are ethnically or linguistically diverse. At the same time, we must plan for serving an aging developmentally delayed population.

In relationship to our need to look ahead, I also am interested in seeing a strengthening of transition services for students in our secondary schools. Our Employment First policy requires that we adequately prepare students for meaningful life in the community and for work, in whatever form that takes for the individual. We must collaborate with the school systems , DOR, DDS, and the legislature to create and fund services which implement what is otherwise an empty legislative promise.

Please explain why you wish to serve on the State Council on Developmental Disabilities, or on one of its Regional Advisory Committees:

I believe that the State Council and the RACs are important advocacy organizations which we cannot afford to ignore in our quest for systemic reform of the DD system. The next few years in our newly reconfigured system will be significant ones during which we will breathe life into the framework. It is important that we create a vibrant Council which leads with courage, and an active grassroots system through the RACs.

What strengths would you bring to the State Council and/or Regional Advisory Committee?

As a passionate advocate and a parent, I believe that I can adequately express the interests of my community with which I have worked for over 35 years. I am articulate, and well-versed in the baroque system which supports the disabled. As a lawyer, I am comfortable with government policy, legislation, and court case law. As an actively involved parent, I can provide a unique perspective of a family member

and caregiver who knows the difficulties and deficits of the current system of supports and services.

medical care, therapy, education, etc.) , through adult issues (such as medical care, housing, employment, transportation, etc.), for ALL impacted individuals regardless of race, religion, or other demographic differences.

Over the last three years, I have been a dedicated and active member of AB10/LA-RAC. I also served in multiple other capacities including working on executive, grants, and nominations committees.
